
Mother Aspen by Annette LeBox


Meet Me on Mercer Street by Booki Vivat

This biography of a baseball great traces Roberto Clemente's triumphs, but also the challenges of racism. Bold, swirling paintings jump off the page, capturing the energy and joy of the life of an inspiring athlete.



This Book Will Make You an Artist by Ruth Millington

25 creative art activities, each inspired by an amazing artist, from Leonardo to Andy Warhol. Step-bystep instructions are paired with brief biographies, resulting in a fun mix of art history and hands-on creation.



Look by Gabi Snyder

There are patterns everywhere we look, from sidewalks to a cat's tail. Unique illustrations of hand-made mixed-media constructions filled with detail and color bring these patterns to life. Each page-turn is a delight.



Golden Gate by Elizabeth Partridge

The incredible construction of the Golden Gate Bridge, as seen through the eyes of a lighthouse keeper's family. Dramatic, intricate illustrations convey the human aspects of an engineering marvel.
