# Did You Know?

Your local public library has Spanish language materials for kids! We have picture books, chapter books, nonfiction books, and board books too. You can also find DVDs, CDs, and book with CD kits. Locating Spanish language materials on the LINCC website is easy.

Do a search for any item, then use the **Limiting Search Results** on the left side to narrow down options. Click on *Children* from the **Audience** options, and then scroll down and click on *Spanish* from the **Language** options. You can even see if materials are available at a specific library by scrolling back to the top and clicking on a specific library from the **Library** options.


# Books We Recommend: Perspectives

This informational and breathtakingly beautiful Caldecott Honor book has us view the variety of life within the walls of this amazing canyon differently than ever before.




#### Peeking Under the City by Esther Porter
