We will be visiting 2nd Graders at all schools on March 15th.

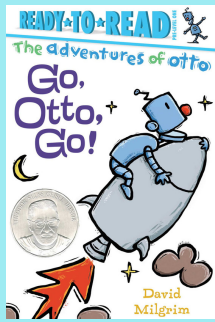
The Children's room is closed for now, but you can still check out kids' books. We've moved them temporarily to the other side of the library.

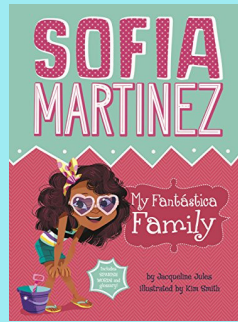
# Books We Recommend: New Go-To Favorites

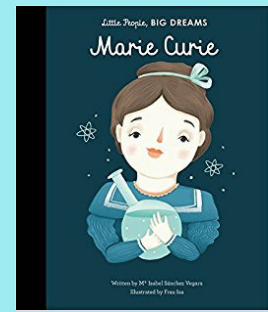
**Go, Otto, Go**

by Jacqueline Jules

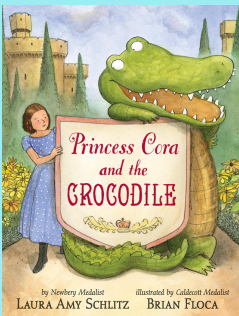
If you reach for *The Princess In Black*, you'll want to meet delightful Sofia and her family in this charming beginning chapter series.

by Isabel Sánchez Vegara

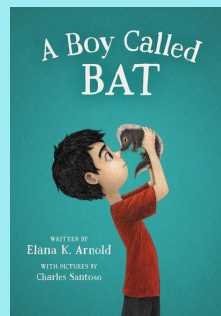
From the series *Little People, Big Dreams* which introduces young readers to incredible women, comes a story of the famous female Nobel winning scientist.

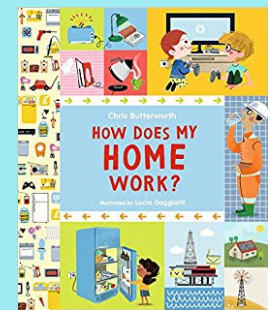
**Princess Cora and the Crocodile**

by Elana Arnold

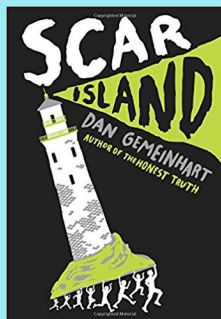

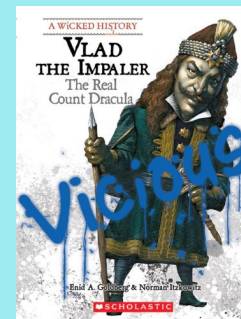
**Scar Island**
